A working definition of community resilience is defined by the Cabinet Office as:

“Communities and individuals harnessing local resources and expertise to help themselves in an emergency, in a way that compliments the response of the emergency services”

Drivers for the development of community resilience are the Cabinet Office's Community Resilience Programme, The Strategic Defence Review and Security Review, which mentions the “focus on building community resilience to civil emergencies, along with lessons identified from emergencies such as those mentioned in Sir Michael Pitt report on the 2007 flooding.

To help children cope in times of an emergency it is important for adults to remember to acknowledge their fears and try to be as honest as possible. (See Guidance card 8)

The information gathered from the questionnaire will be analysed to inform the development Schools Community Resilience Programme within the Borough over time. Please note that the information collected by this questionnaire will be strictly confidential.
